The lowest register of the thermometer for the winter so far reported was this morning, being eight degrees below freezing point.

The fishing and hunting party composed of Messrs. R. F. Hill, W. E. Parrott and Dr. Wm. Edwards returned this morning from Havelock. "Nothing doing."

The switchboard of the telephone company at this place is now full. A new section has been ordered which is expected in a few days. The total number of phones now on the list is 200.

Eleanor Vale, the 19-month-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. E. S. Pittman, died this morning about 7 o'clock of pneumonia. The remains will be interred in the cemetery tomorrow morning at 10 o'clock.
