Of the 9,282 suicides whose domiciles are known, 4,968 lived in rural sexes it is the domestic who shows the largest proportion of suicides; professions.

The motives in the average 100 of aldermen, and other city officials suicide, are: Twenty-one from physical suffering; 15 from misery or reverses of fortune; 13 from drunkenness; 12 from domestic troubles; 9 from thwarted love; 4 from debauchery: 2 from unknown motives, and 24 from heat. There are always more suicides in the spring and summer than in the automn and winter.
