## STREET IMPROVEMENT.

In referring to Raleigh's recent progressive action in issuing bonds to the amount of \$100,000 for street improvements the Wilmington Dispatch says:

"The voters of the Capital City were evidently not frightened over a bond issue; in fact, not the 'teeny weenie' bit, according to the great majority rolled up for the bonds, the vote being 1,024 for, to 135 against. It is wrong to shiver at a bond issue, merely because it is a bond issue. The question always is:

"What will we get in return?"

"A town has to invest in certain things the same as the merchant. If the merchant didn't buy goods he wouldn't stay in business long. If a town doesn't spend money for public utilities, especially for health work and good streets, it will not progress, but will surely retrogress. This does not mean that every time a bond issue is proposed that it should be voted; any more so than a merchant should overstock, buy from every 'drummer' who comes along, but it does mean not to get gun shy whenever a bond issue is talked of. It also means that the fact that it is a bond issue and the further fact that there might be increased taxation have nothing to do with the merits of the case. The question at issue is what will the bond issue accomplish? Is it needed now and will the money be judiciously expended?"

"The old cry of 'bond issue,' used like the old yell of 'wolf,' is something that is, miserly unjust, or retrogression in disguise. If the bond money is not needed, or trickery is feared that is one thing, and a reason that can be cited against it, but simply because it is a bond issue and carries increased taxation is not a reason against, but a subterfuge to stab it in the back. It's the returns to be obtained that count first.

"That town that doesn't spend money never gets beyond the municipal graveyard."

These considerations are well put. A city must develop itself just as private individual must develop his property if he would succeed. A city that lags behind in equipping itself with the ordinary conveniences and necessities of city life is doomed to the "municipal graveyard."

It is time that Kinston were awakening to this fact. We Kinstonians know that we have a good town. In many respects we have surpassed and in some respects unequalled facilities. But there are certain requirements of modern city life we fail to measure up to and the most prominent of these is adequate street and sidewalk pavement. The sand-clay pavement is very satisfactory as a roadway where the traffic is not dense; but a dirt pavement is not satisfactory for sidewalks, except in fine, dry weather—and in this section we have frequent rains. We do not think that the

city ought to actually pave the sidewalks, but it certainly should grade them all and curb them too. This being done each property owner should be required to pave in front of his property. This would not be a real hardship on anybody and the town would not have to go to any great expense in doing its part. And this year should not elapse before it is done.

Oscar Straus hit the nail on the head when he asked the senate canal committee, "Are we to sacrifice our self-respect or the opinions of mankind for a miserable mess of potage?"

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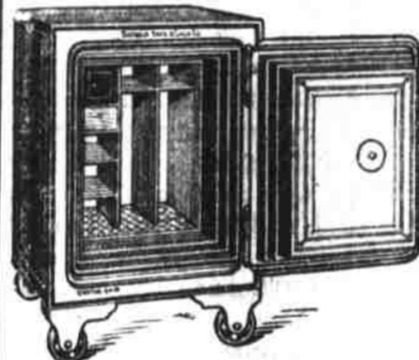
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
