Professor Conklin of Princeton Dis-
cusses Feminist Movement.

Princeton, N. J., April 17.—That
the feminist movement may result in
race suicide was the warning sound-
ed by Prof. Edwin Grant Conklin, of
Princeton, in a lecture on "Eugenics
and Ethics" here.

"The feminist movement may in-
augurate a greater freedom of
thought, but if it also brings freedom
from marriage and its responsibili-
ties, it is suicidal," he said.

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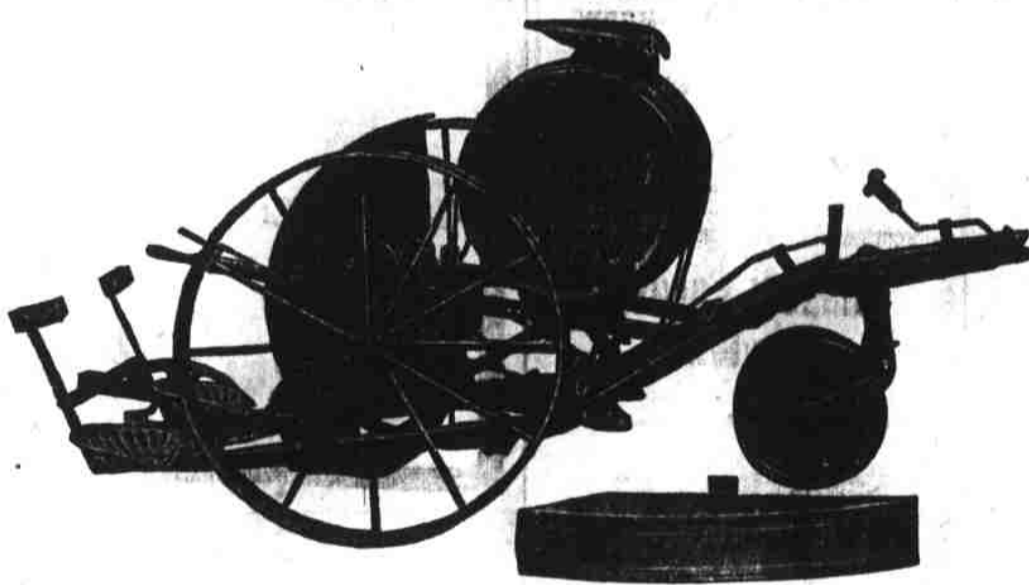
