Commencement exercises are on at the colored McDaniel Normal and Industrial school, Lincoln City, and will continue through Thursday. The institution has had a successful session.

Twelve hundred feet of new four-inch water mains on several streets in East Kinston were Friday afternoon tested with 125 pounds pressure. Three hydrants were installed with the pipe.

A steam pipe line is being laid at the school for the feeble-minded by a Goldsboro construction company, and other finishing work is going on in preparing the institution for the opening in summer.

The public school at Deep Run will close on Friday, April 24. A picnic will be given on the school ground at noon. County Superintendent Kinsey and another orator not yet selected will make addresses.

There will be a meeting of the guarantors of the June chautauqua in the office of F. I. Sutton, Esq., Monday afternoon at 4 to elect officers. There are 53 of the guarantors and every one is asked to be present.

Rev. Howard Allgood, of Belhaven, who is expected to assist in St. Mary's parish here this summer, has notified the rector, Rev. Jno. H. Griffith, that he will not arrive in Kinston until Sunday evening. He was scheduled to conduct two services at St. Mary's Sunday, but will preach only at night, when the service will begin at 8 o'clock. Mr. Allgood is a young Episcopal minister whose present charges include St. Thomas', the oldest church in the state, at Bath.

In a baseball game at Athletic park Friday afternoon between of Kinston and New Bern high schools, the locals won, 11 to 7. Kinston was credited with 13 hits and eight errors, and New Bern with eight hits and six errors. Fleming for the locals struck out five and McSorley for New Bern fanned nine. Each permitted one man to walk. Fleming and McSorley each secured three-base hits. This morning the New Bern team went to Goldsboro, and the Kinston team to Pikeville.

Mr. Joseph Lane, aged 32, died at his home on East street early this morning. He was a victim of Bright's disease. Surviving are a widow and three children. Mr. Lane was a millwright by trade. He was a member of the Masonic fraternity. He was well-known in the city and esteemed by all his acquaintances. The funeral, conducted by Rev. B. P. Smith, pastor of the Christian church, will be held Sunday afternoon at 3 o'clock, with interment in Maplewood cemetery.

With the shad season more than half gone, fishermen of the upper Neuse are complaining that the catch has been only about 50 per cent of that of last year, despite the fact that recent hauls in the rivers have been enormous. Continued coldness of the water is believed by some to have kept the fish from coming upstream, but others are inclined to the belief that obstructions in the way of nets at downriver points, has cut off the supply. A couple of years ago patrol boats opened up a passage for the shad on Neuse river.

Revival services which have been going on in Queen Street Methodist church for a week will continue all next week, and the regular services there tomorrow will be incorporated in the series. A sermon will be preached by the pastor at 11 o'clock. Special music by the choir will be directed by Prof. I. N. Price, a singing evangelist of Chatham. He will render one or two solos. At

3 o'clock a meeting for men only will be held, and every man in the city is urged to attend. The pastor will preach on "Nevertheless, the Hair of His Head Begun to Grow". Professor Price will direct the music. The evening service will be held at 8. The pastor will preach. The choir will comprise 20 or 30 voices.
