Detroit, Mich., June 23.—William L. Carpenter, the meat market owner who was attacked by Tyrus Cobb Saturday night today asked Prosecuting Attorney Allan H. Fraser to issue a warrant for the ball player's arrest. The prosecutor told Carpenter he should apply to one of the police justices for a warrant of that nature. Up to the middle of the afternoon, however, Carpenter had not appeared before any of the police court officials.

Another Building for Reynolds Co.

Winston-Salem, June 23.—The Reynolds Tobacco company this afternoon announced the completion of plans for the erection of its third steel reinforced concrete building, which will involve more than \$100,000 when equipped. The building is peculiarly constructed according to scientific principles for conditioning leaf tobacco. It will be 66 by 194 feet, ten stories, with a height of 100 feet.

New Brunswick, N. J. Three members of the Massachusetts chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution left Philadelphia two days ago to cover the route taken by Washington. A tablet will be unveiled at Elizabeth tomorrow.

London, June 24.—The wild rose was the only badge that enabled pedestrians to pass unmolested through London streets unconditionally to an army of 20,000 white-robed flower-sellers, who waylaid the florally adorned and reminded them that it was Alexandria Day. Inaugurated a couple of years ago to celebrate the fiftieth anniversary of Queen Mother Alexandria's arrival in England, Alexandria Day has become an annual floral fete, and the esteem in which King George's mother is held was shown by the unanimity with which Britishers donned her favorite flower.
