(Centimied from Page One) where the surface becomes soft of sticky under the sun's rays, or where it "bleeds," it may be positively stated that the material is not natural lake asphalt, but prepared hydro-carbons derived from artificial sources.

Street and road foundations are always a matter of locality, and local materials should be used to as great an extent as possible. Washed gravel makes a good concrete for foundations where broken stone is too expensive. "Cementitious" gravel, which is bank gravel with a slight admixture of clay, makes a good foundation for country roads where the travel is not excessive, and where it is well rolled with a heavy roller before the surface course is applied. Sometimes a coarse sand is found which makes an excellent mineral aggregate for a concrete foundation. This, however, requires a somewhat larger proportion of cement.

In nearly every locality careful engineering study will develop some material or combination of materials, which will provide adequate foundations for city streets and country roads. Competent engineers should be encouraged to study the possible road materials in each locality, and the United States office of public roads will cheerfully make the necessary chemical tests, without charge, to demonstrate the value of local ma-

Many thousands of dollars have been wasted by local authorities through lack of technical information regarding the value of materials within reach. In the present age oprogress, economy consists in employing trained minds for the performance of technical duties, and the use of thoroughly tried materials whereever they are available.

That "anybody can build roads" is undoubtedly true. But that the ultimate cost of roads and streets built by other than competent men, and with other than adequate materials is unduly excessive, and the results unsatisfactory, is likewise true. The best men and the best materials pro
