BIG TOBACCO BREAKS.

Between 250,000 and 300,000 pounds of tobacco were sold on this market today. These breaks are considered unusually heavy for Monday, and are regarded as presaging big sales for the entire week. Prices ruled well.

PINK HILL ALLEGED RETAILERS IN JAIL.

W. T. Roberts, Annie Cox and Henry Willis, all colored, are in the county jail here charged with retailing, having failed to give bonds of \$100 each exacted by Magistrate Jesse J. Smith at Pink Hill. The trio are alleged to have been unusually bold in the whiskey traffic.

NEGRO SHOOT WIFE AND ESCAPES.

Sylvester Sutton, a negro, is sought by the sheriff for an assault with a deadly weapon upon his wife in Bucklesberry late Saturday night. Sutton, for a reason unknown to the authorities, is alleged to have shot away a portion of the woman's scalp, inflicting a severe, although not necessarily fatal wound. A shotgun was the weapon used. Sutton fled immediately after the shooting.

JEWISH DAY OF ATONEMENT.

Yom Kipper, the Hebrew day of repentance and atonement will be observed by the local Jews Tuesday evening and all day Wednesday in the synagogue on Queen street. On this day the Jews supplicate to God to forgive their sins after expressing their repentance. The day will be observed as a holiday by the Jewish population in Kinston, and places of business will be closed. Rabbi I. Goodkowitz will preside at the religious exercises in the temple.

REDUCING CHANCES FOR TYPHOID.

The plumbers are doing a rushing business now installing sanitary closets in houses adjacent to recent sewer extensions in the outlying portions of the city, in accordance with the law. In the past 30 days 39 such closets have been installed in Kinston. It is believed that when the new sewer lines are laid following the sale of the June bond issue, every dwelling in the corporate limits will be connected, so complete will be the system.

KINSTONIAN ON U. N. C. FOOTBALL TEAM.

Reynold Allen, son of Judge O. H. Allen, of Kinston, played in Saturday's football game between the University of North Carolina and Richmond, in which the Tarheels scored 41 to the Virginians' 0. Allen is a law student, who is taking a post-graduate course at the University, and is a star of several years' standing on the varsity eleven. He is an ex-Kinston high school star, also. A sub. on this year's University team is Phil. Hines, another former K. H. S. player, who was last year's star as halfback.

UNIVERSALIST CONVENTION CLOSES.

The State convention of the Universalist church closed Sunday night in the church of the Eternal Hope, at McLewcan and Lenoir streets, with a large audience hearing discussion of Universalism by a number of ministers from the churches represented. The convention in 1915 will be held at Red Springs, in Sampson county. L. L. Matthews was re-elected president of the convention. Mr. Matthews, of Clinton, is superintendent of schools for Sampson county, and one of the most representative laymen of the denomination.

MATTHEW CARR DEAD.

Mr. Matthew H. Carr, aged about 35, died late Sunday at his farm, "Sunny Acres," near Grifton. An injury suffered during childhood is believed to have been the cause of his demise. He was a member of a prominent Lenoir family, and was generally known in Kinston, where he spent much of his time. His wife survives. The remains were brought here on the A. C. L. train this afternoon for interment. The Knights of Pythias, in which order he held membership were represented at the funeral, which was held in Maplewood cemetery.

PALMIST ACCUSED FALSE PRETENSE.

Prof. D. Berns, a palmist fortune-teller, has been served with a warrant by the police for securing money by false pretense. The warrant was issued by the mayor upon complaint of a colored girl, who alleged that Berns collected the advertised fee of 50 cents, when she visited his place on West Caswell street to have her palm "read," and upon his discovering that the reading was unsatisfactory desired her to place another half dollar upon a table, which she said he stated was essential to the procedure. He pocketed the second 50 cents, the plaintiff accused, and all her efforts to have him return the money were unavailing.

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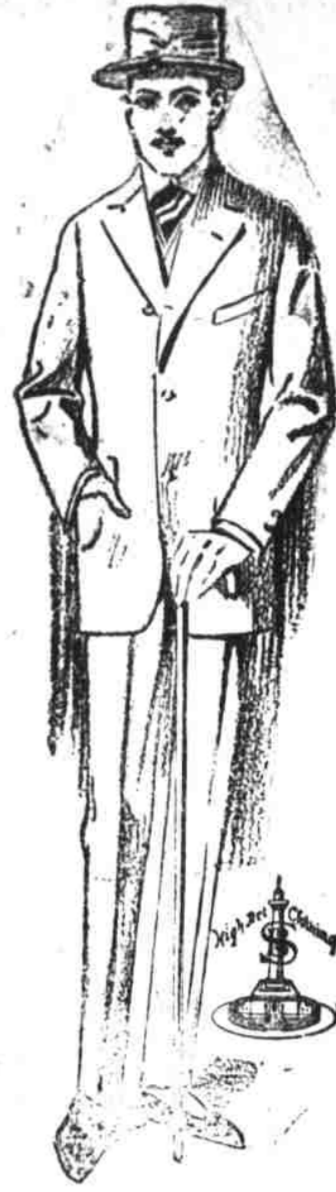
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
