967 BALES COTTON GINNED IN COUNTY BY SEPT. 25.

The tabulation of separate returns from ginners shows that 967 bales of cotton, counting round as half bales, were ginned in Lenoir county from the 1914 crop up to September 25, as compared with 737 bales ginned prior to the same date in 1913.

Bert Holt, colored, was brought through Kinston Friday en route to the colored hospital for the insane at Goldsboro. The man was bound and handcuffed. He was violently insane, and attracted considerable attention at a number of places along the road. Holt's home is in Maysville.

The climax of the misunderstanding came when Miss Casey ran out to the street and began whipping Mrs. Antwine. The latter was armed with a bludgeon. Mrs. Casey was more successful at horsewhipping than was her daughter. It required a doctor's services for Miss Casey when Mrs. Antwine knocked her out with the club. The girl's scalp was badly damaged. Mrs. Antwine was arrested for assault.

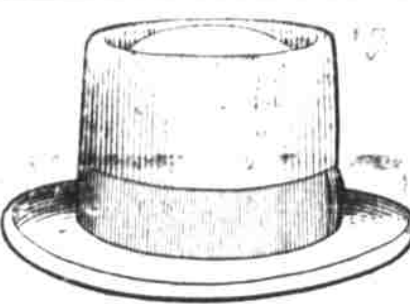
