

> EXPERT SAYS PELLAGRA COMES FROM IMPROPER **PROPORTION OF FOOD.**

Sayannah, Ga., Oct. 28 .- "The government's investigations have led to the definite conclusion that pellagra comes from living on a one-sided diet, and that it is in no way contagious or infectious," said Dr. Joseph Goldberger, of the United States Public Health Service, here today.

"Only those whose diet contains too little of certain classes of proteid foods, such as milk, lean meat or legumes (beans and peas) develop the disease," continued Dr. Goldberger.
