**HEALTH BOARD RE-ELECTS DR. WEYHER & WOOTEN**

Drs. V. E. Weyher of the city and R. W. Wooten of the county have been re-elected members of the County Board of Health by the three remaining members, Chairman Churchhill of the County Commissioners; Mayor Sutton and Superintendent of County Schools Kinsey. The terms of Drs. Wooten and Weyher expired on January 4. The first meeting of the board since their re-election will be held on next Monday.

The County Board of Health as constituted by law consists of the chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, the mayor of the county seat, the superintendent of public instruction, and two practicing physicians who shall be appointed by the first-named three. In every instance the chairman of the commissioners is chairman of the board and the superintendent of schools is secretary.

The Board of Health has the responsibility of electing a County Superintendent of Health, or county physician, which office is now held by Dr. Albert DeKalb Parrott of the city. Formerly there were two physicians in the service of the board, one being the county physician and the other the "quarantine officer." The last-named was abolished several years ago at the instance of then Mayor W. D. LaRoque. The combining of the two offices is said to have worked out very satisfactorily and at a considerable saving to the community.

**BUILDING AND LOAN IN GOOD CONDITION**

The Mutual Building and Loan Association, started only two years ago under the auspices of the Chamber of Commerce, will show in its annual statement to be issued to the shareholders soon that it is in fine condition.
