Vienna Reports No Change in Situation. Vienna, Jan. 18.—The War Office declares the situation everywhere to have been little changed. South of Tarnow artillery duels continue. In the Carpathians the weather holds the combatants in their own trenches.

Berlin, Jan. 18.—The Allies lost 100,000 men since December, according to the war office. It is claimed that in German East Africa, where eight thousand British engaged two thousand Germans the British lost three thousand. The Germans shelled and set fire to a British transport steamer and badly damaged the British cruiser Fox.

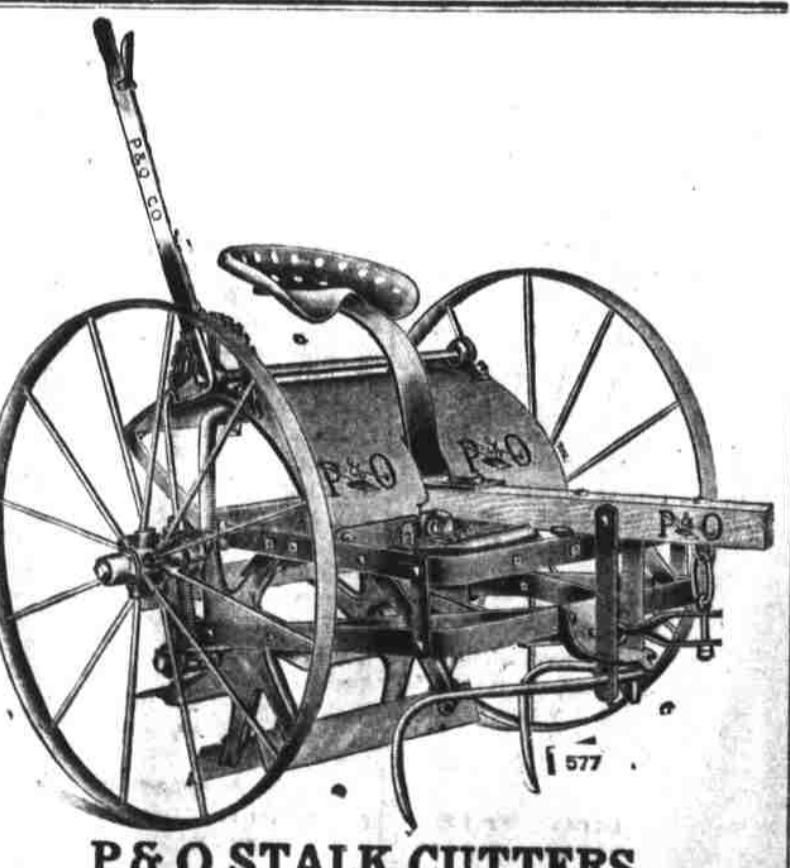
