## OF LOCAL INTEREST

### ALONZA THOMAS DEAD.

Alonza Thomas, one of Beaufort's best-known citizens and known to many Kinston people, died there on Thursday evening, according to a report received today. The funeral was conducted Friday afternoon.

### NEGRES SWHO WORKED FRAUD GAME TO ROADS

The Recorder Friday sentenced Jessie May Jones, colored, to 12 months on the county roads, where she will serve as a cook, for securing money from North Kinston housewives through fraud. Her method was to apply at a home and, pretending to be in the employ of a neighbor, ask for the loan of money for her alleged mistress. The plan worked well. The Jones woman claims to be from Pitt county.

### NOAH LEE'S VESSEL IS RELEASED BY OFFICERS.

U. S. Deputy Collector I. M. Tall of this city Friday was at New Bern arranging for the release of the gasboat Fannie Brevard, owned by Noah Lee, now serving time for illicit dealing in whisky. Lee's wife told Judge Henry G. Connor that the boat was the sole means of support of herself and children, and he recommended that it be turned over to her. The boat had been confiscated according to law.

### DEATH OF MRS. W. J. BLALOCK AT NEW BERN.

Mrs. W. J. Blalock, wife of a prominent New Bern man, died in Wilson late Thursday. She had been in a hospital in the latter place. The remains were brought through this city en route to New Bern, where the funeral was held Friday afternoon, Rev. Euclid McWhorter, pastor of Centenary Methodist church, officiating. Mrs. Blalock was a sister-in-law of Mr. R. A. Blalock of this city, and niece to Mrs. W. A. McIntosh, a New Bern woman well known here.

### CASE OR SUMRELL VS. RAILROAD IS ENDED.

In Superior Court this morning the jury in Sumrell vs. Railroad, two suits combined in which Claud Sumrell, a policeman, was suing the Atlantic Coast Line Railroad for damages to his minor son, Eugene Sumrell, etc., awarded Claud Sumrell \$100 and his son \$500. It was alleged that while the lad was in a car helping unload furniture, a locomotive of the defendant backed into the car, jarring the boy out of the car to the ground and seriously injuring him.

## NEWS IN BRIEF OF OTHER CITIES AND COUNTIES NEARBY

The executive committee of the East Carolina Teachers' Training school Friday accepted from the contractors a new building to replace one destroyed by fire some time ago. The late ex-Governor Jarvis' place on the executive board has not been filled.

Pending the rebuilding of the burned Norfolk Southern shop at New Bern, the work generally gone by the shop there will be distributed between the Norfolk and Raleigh shops, says F. L. Nicholson, chief engineer of the road. Mr. Nicholson expects the New Bern shop to be rebuilt at an early date.

Now Dare county has seen the mysterious airship, glimpsed during the past two or three months in Craven, Lenoir, Jones, Onslow, Pamlico and Beaufort counties. A report from Buffalo City in Dare says three or four reliable citizens saw the flyer, first high up in the air and then just above treetops near the town.

The schooner Centennial sunk at her dock in Neuse river at New Bern during the gale. The cargo was lost.

Dr. G. M. Cooper, a State Board of Health expert, will work in New Bern for one day during the Anti-Tuberculosis week in December. He will make several lectures.

There have been forty abdominal operations in three weeks at St. Luke's, New Bern's new hospital.
