RURAL MAILLER CARRIER EXAMINATIONS TO BE HELD

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced an examination for Kinston, on October 14, to fill the position of rural carrier at Pink Hill. and vacancies that may later occur on routes from Ither postoffices in the above-mentioned county.
