London, Nov. 4 .- It is feared that 300 perished in a collision of the British steamers Connemara and Retriever in the Irish

Only one survivor has been reported officially.

El Paso, Nov. 4.-Col. Rosario Garcia, Villista leader, and two of his followers were executed at daybreak at Juarez. Before facing the firing squad Garcia in a long speech, declared he was not a Villista, but a Constitutionalist, and asked that care be taken of his family.

One of the bandits shot with him was only 17 years old,
