Farm Loan Association.

Mr. W. R. Camp, State organizer, will come to Kinston Wednesday in the interest of the farm loan association work. He will hold a meeting in the Courthouse Wednesday night at eight o'clock for the purpose of organizing a local farm loan association. Mr. Camp is also interested in creating better marketing facilities and those farmers who are interested in marketing hogs in car load lots are invited to be present Wednesday and confer with Mr. Camp.

Hard Problem For Court.

What to do with the street walkers and fallen women is a problem that constantly confronts the Mayor's court. Monday morning Eunice Wiggins, Betty Morgan and Tiffany Pate, the latter a girl apparently about sixteen years of age, were before the court and the two last named were given the option of leaving town—they both claimed to have homes to which they could go—before night or serve a sentence of 30 days in jail. The Wiggins woman is the occupant of the house on Heritage street where the women were rounded up. She was allowed to go with the warning that any more such offenses as permitting women to congregate at her house for alleged immoral purposes would subject her to a thirty day sentence. The case against Thomas Parker for abandonment was set for Monday afternoon.

Dr. LaRoque, Hospital Head.

Dr. G. Paul LaRoque, brother of Messrs. Mab, Walter and Frank of Kinston, has been appointed medical director of the Virginia Hospital, a place of considerable responsibility. The following notice of his appointment is clipped from the Richmond News-Leader:

Dr. G. Paul LaRoque has been appointed medical director of Virginia hospital, the city home and Pine Camp. The position is a new one created by the administrative board.

Dr. LaRoque practically takes the place of the superintendent of Virginia hospital, and if he sees fit to reorganize the service the board will probably give him a free hand. It is said that his appointment is made for this purpose and that the board decided to add the city home and Pine Camp with the idea of connecting them more closely with Virginia hospital, thus giving the city a better system for the treatment of all kinds of patients, from emergency cases to contagious diseases.

Dr. LaRoque studied at Bellevue hospital, New York, before taking up practice in Richmond and is regarded as an authority on hospital organization. The board has elected Dr. Stuart Michaux and Dr. R. C. Fravel to the Virginia hospital staff, to succeed Dr. Lowmes Peple and Dr. George Bryan, now on war duty.

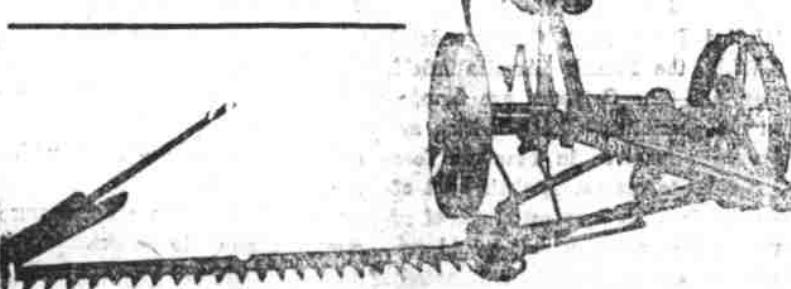

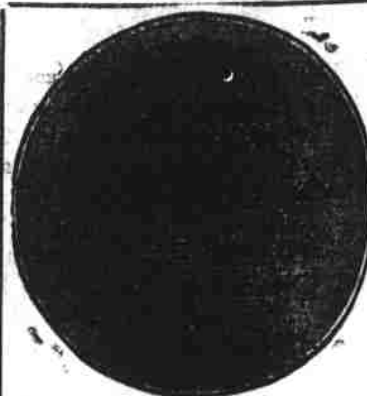
