For North Carolina: Probably rain tonight and Sunday. Warmer tonight in East and Central portions. Colder in West portion Sunday. Moderate South winds.

To Preach to Scouts.

School Play.

Officer Resigns.
Patrolman George Kilpatrick has resigned from the police force, effective Saturday. The reason was Officer Kilpatrick's preference for another kind of employment.

Pork Increase.
Lenoir County is called upon to increase its hog population by 2,355 this year, Agricultural Agent W. T. Kyzer announced Saturday. This is an estimated increase of 10 per cent.

Red Cross Meeting Monday.
The regular monthly meeting of the Kinston Red Cross Chapter will be held at the Red Cross quarters on North Queen Street Monday evening. A full attendance is urged.

Bring Jones Prisoners Here.
Supt. Frank Rhem of the county roads force has affected an arrangement whereby Jones County's convicted prisoners are to be brought to Lenoir County to work on the roads. Jones does not use them. There are too few of them to bother with there.

Union Service.
The sixth joint service to save fuel of the six congregations of the Baptists, Disciples of Christ, Episcopalians, Methodists and Presbyterians here will be held Sunday night at Gordon Street Christian Church. Rev. W. Marshall Craig, pastor of the First Baptist Church, will be the preacher. This service will be somewhat different. The sermon will be evangelistic, and the whole service will have the evangelistic touch.

Baptists to Confer on Education Money.
A conference of ministers and prominent laymen of the Neuse-Atlantic Baptist Association will be held here February 19 to discuss and plan for the \$1,000,000-for-education campaign to be waged by the denomination in the State shortly. The campaign was authorized at the last State convention. The Neuse-Atlantic Association embraces the churches in a large part of East Carolina, and the conference here will be important. The high school maintained by the Baptists at Winterville will benefit largely by the million-dollar campaign.

Reducing Tobacco Acreage.
Farming operations in Lenoir County are getting into full swing. Delayed by the prolonged cold weather since Christmas, the planters could do little toward preparing for the Spring planting until this week. They are breaking ground and overhauling machinery now. Thousands

of dollars' worth of wheeled and small implements went to ruin during the Winter, of course, as happens every Winter, because of the negligence of the owners. The tools are being reclaimed from the mud and rust now, such of them as are fit for use. Everywhere in this section the farmers are planning to reduce the tobacco acreage. Reports are being received from every neighborhood to this effect.

Teachers' Committee to Meet at Raleigh.

At the last annual convention of the State Teachers' Assembly Prof. K. E. Curtis, superintendent of the Kinston Schools, introduced an amendment to the constitution of the body providing that in future only regularly-delegated representatives of teachers' associations, such as were or should be organized, should have voice in the business deliberations of the convention. A motion was made to appoint a committee to outline a proposition to be submitted to the next convention. This committee, comprised by Supt. Curtis as chairman, the superintendents of Wake County and Durham city schools, a member of the University faculty and the president of Peace Institute, will meet at Raleigh at 11 a. m. Tuesday at Prof. Curtis' call issued Saturday.
