

commercial spring water. Eighteen are in this group, 6 of them showing no pollution and 12 showing a percentage ranging from 7 to 100. One of the perfect scores in this group is made by Seven Springs which showed no pollution in the 9 samples analyzed.

A study of these three groups reveals the fact that summer resort and commercial spring waters are not always safe and a little investigation before putting too much faith in them is not out of order.
