In June, however, there was a great rush, and figures will show that business returned to within 13 1-2 per cent of normal in less than a month's time.

The Baltimore and Ohio and the Pennsylvania Railroad will also show a great increase in business when their books close tomorrow night for June. It was estimated at the close of business today that busines for June would be within 20 per cent of the June business of last year, which was the biggest of last year, whichshrdlutaoin gest June in history.

This shows that the June business was better than the average month of any year, save 1907, when every known record was shattered.
