



on Had to Fight Them With Clubs When Entering Her

Philadelphia, July 37.—Summon-ed by a mysterious telephone call, the author of which they have been unable to And, police of the Twan-tieth and Hutteswood station forced their way into a house at 650 North Sixteenth street and found the body of Sarah Lippincott Starr, an aged recluse, in a squalid room, guarded by five savage cats, which realisted the efforts of the police to disturb the woman's body, and which had to be clubbed out of the house.

be clubbed out of the house. In the faint light the body was found, dressed in rags, roughly sewn

together. Victoria Lippincott Starr, sister of Victoria Lippincott Starr, inster of the dead woman, who was out on an errand when the police forced an entrance to her home, became angry when she returned and saw what they had done. She at first refused to allow them to carry the body from the house, but later consented and told what she thought had caused the death the death.

She said that a week ago, while her sister was sewing, she pricted her finger with the needle and that blood poisoning set in. Her hand and arm were both swollen and dis-

cclored. The sister said that the woman slipped from a couch on which she was sleeping and that later she fell down stairs. Injuries resulting from these falls are thought to have hastened her death.


The sisters are of an old Quaker family of New Jersey. When their parents died their property was all left to them, and they had lived in comfort for several years, after which they were forced to occupy the small room in the North Sixeenth street house.




