CITY ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern: That Chapter 13 of the ordinances of the city of New Bern be amended by striking out Section 3 thereof and, in lieu thereof, inserting the following: Sec. 3. "Any person, firm or corporation who shall keep open any store or shop on Sunday for the purpose of buying, selling and transacting business, except in cases of necessity, shall upon conviction, pay a fine of ten dollars for each and every offense. "But drug stores and apothecary shops may be kept open at all times for the sale of drugs and medicines, toilet articles and soaps, and such other merchandise as may be necessary in case of sickness or accident; provided this ordinance shall not apply to the sale of milk or ice at any time, nor to the delivery of ice cream prior to 10:45 o'clock a. m. "Violation of this ordinance to sell Coca-Cola, Pepsi-Cola, or other soft drinks by whatever name called, or ice cream, cigars, cigarettes or tobacco except by hotels and bona fide restaurants in their places of business and in the ordinary conduct of their business."
