CITY ORDINANCE.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern: That Chapter 13 of the ordinances of the city of New Bern be amended

Provided further, that it shall be violation of this ordinance to sell Coca-Cola, Pepsi-Cola, or other soft drinks by whatever name called, or ice cream, cigars, cigarettes or tobacco except by hotels and bona fide restaurants in their places of business and in the ordinary conduct of
