CITY ORDINANCE.
Alderman Ellis moved the adoption of the following ordinance: Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of New Bern: Section 1. That chapter 4 of the ordinances of the city be amended by adding at the end thereof the following:
Section 40. All railroad companies maintaining a track or tracks across any street in the city shall between the rails of and on each side of such track or tracks either pave the width of such street or lay plank thereon in such manner as to permit vehicles to cross without difficulty or excessive jolting. Whoever violates this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined ten dollars; and each day such track or tracks shall be maintained in violation thereof shall constitute a separate and distinct offense.
Alderman Dawson seconded the motion and upon vote of the board the resolution was adopted.

ARMORED STEEL AUTOS FOR WAR

Orders For 1,000 Cars Placed With American Firms by European Powers.

Philadelphia, Aug. 28.—Armored steel automobiles for use by the European powers engaged in war are being manufactured here by the Auto Car Company and will be shipped as soon as completed. The cars have been sold to nations on each side of the conflict. One order includes fourteen cars, which will be used by the British government. Negotiations with France, Russia and Greece have also been entered into, and it is said orders for 1,000 cars have been placed by various powers.

A large New England company will mount rapid-fire machine guns on the cars.

Cars ordered by England will be shipped from Philadelphia to private individuals in Canada and thence reshipped to the front.

Thomasville, Ga., Aug. 28.—Whether to wear cotton clothes this winter should the war in Europe continue is a question being discussed by a number of the women of Thomasville and some are very strongly in favor of the movement.

Mrs. Z. I. Fitzpatrick, president of the State Federation of Women's clubs, and president of the Thomasville Study class, has taken the matter up very warmly, and is using all of her influence to have the other women of the community join.

CANADA AND CHINA TALK IMMIGRATION

Chinese Government Hopes to Get Entrance Tax of \$500 Per Head Abolished.

(By United Press.)
VANCOUVER, Aug. 28.—Negotiations are in progress today between the Canadian government and the Chinese republic with a view to an agreement for control of Chinese immigration into Canada.

President Yuan Shi Kai is understood to have intimated he would indorse such a compact as the one by which 400 Japanese are admitted into the Dominion yearly. He would like, however, to have the present \$500 head tax paid by the Chinese abolished.

The opinion here is that an agreement of the kind would facilitate the negotiation of a similar arrangement with the imperial government concerning Hindu immigration.
