(By United Press.) THE HAGUE, Sept. 16 .- Can Germany be starved out? The question has been asked a thousand times. If the chancellories of England, France and Russia knew the answer, one of the biggest problems of the military strategists would be solved. Opinions on this mooted point vastly differ.
