Lieutenant Colonel Andrew D. Raleigh has instituted suit against the Carolina Street Railway for \$30,000 damages as a result of a fracture of his leg last June.

The penitentiary authorities tried to take away 30 convicts employed on the Raleigh & Cape Fear Railroad, but the contractor refused to give them up and threatened a suit.

Mr. H. S. Blair, editor of the Lenoir Topics, has withdrawn from the race as an independent candidate for the Legislature in Caldwell.

F. Chevrons, a foreigner, supposed to be an Italian, was arrested in Durham recently and carried to Raleigh to answer the charge of assault and battery upon Agostino Kearns, another foreigner.

Another call has been made on Colonel Burdette to carry out his original plan of having a court-martial investigate the charges against Chief Surgeon Stockard, of the Second Regiment.

Tarheel Notes. H. E. Robertson, Esq., of Davis county, died recently. Mr. Robertson was a tobacco manufacturer and had represented his county in the Legislature. He was 50 years old and was prominent in Masonic circles.

State Auditor Ayer says there is now about \$900,000 in the State Treasury, against which there stands about \$70,000 of appropriations made in 1907 and 1908 by the Legislature.

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The Official Gazette at Havana publishes a decree signed by Captain General Blanco and bearing date of September 27th, granting pardon to, and ordering the release of, all political prisoners now undergoing confinement in the island.

Dr. Nancey Guilford has been arrested in London. The Spanish government estimates that there are 200,000 people in Porto Rico who desire to return to Spain.

The Spanish naval officers who recently arrived at Santander, Spain, on board the City of Rome, from Portsmouth, N. H., have been entertained at a ball given by the officers of the German training ship Charlotte.

A duel between M. Charles Ernest Panlmer and M. Turot, of the Laurence, was fought at Paris, rapiers being the weapons used. M. Turot was thrice wounded in the thigh and side, and M. Panlmer was slightly wounded on the hip.

Hospital Station. Acting Postmaster General Heath has ordered the establishment on October 10th of a temporary station of the Fort Monroe, Va., postoffice at the general military hospital near the old fort.

A Revision of the Dreyfus Case Assured. It is semi-officially asserted in Paris that M. Manon, the procurator general, has sent a report to the court of Cassation which ensures a revision of the Dreyfus case.

Seaboard Air Line Affairs. The annual meeting of the stockholders of the Seaboard Air Line was held at Portsmouth, Va., on the 14th inst.

Henry George Declines. Henry George has declined the nomination for Governor of New York on the ticket placed in the field by the Chicago platform Democrats.
