A North Carolina Farmer.
There is a farmer in North Carolina who has a reasonable prospect of gathering on his crop for 1885, 225,000 pounds of corn, 174,000 pounds of cotton, 250,000 bushels of corn. It required over 500 bags fertilizer to plant this immense crop. The soil, being so rich, fresh land, requires no fertilizer. To have such a crop produced is not very difficult. To have it produced as it leaves a better profit to the principal producer. "His labor, his care, his." This farmer made his first cotton in the year 1867. There was a severe panic in the fall of 1867. Cotton fell to 7 cents per pound and many farmers were ruined. This man had slept on a bank and patched his own clothes during the year and owed nothing on his crop. He sold in the spring at 28 cents and had money. At that time he did not own an acre of land. He now owns very many acres, some very valuable ones, made principally by farming with close economy.
