#### LEGISLATURE PROCEEDINGS.

Senators Dockery and Elliott Cuarlotte Observer. introduced joint bills last Thursday calling for a constitutional conin June, 1911, and also measures providing that general elections shall be held every four years instead of every two, which, of course, would mean the Legislature to meet quadriennially instead of biennially.

The Barringer bill for a new judicial district to be composed of Guilford and Alamance counties, which was passed by the Senate yesterday on its second reading by 21 to 19, was killed today on its third reading by 18 to 25.

About two hours of the time of the upper branch was consumed in debating the Britt bill for the election of county boards of education by vote of the people in the various counties, the same question that was argued for nearly four hours in the House when a similar bill was killed. Senator Britt made the principal speech for the measure, and his efforts were seconded by Senator Starbuck. 
