

The Destruction of Portland, Me., In Colonial Days.

ACT OF AN ENGLISH OFFICER.

A Royalist Woman's Wiler Caused the Annihilation of the City and Saved Portsmouth, N. H., For Which Portland's Fate Had Been Planned.

One of the causes of the Revolution ary war, and quite as important a one as the stamp act, was the wanton destruction of the city of Purtland. Me., then part of the town of Falmouth

It was said that the patriots might have forgiven Lexington and Concord. but that the razing of this town, which had been peaceably inclined until then. incensed the colonies beyond measure. One prompt result was the immediate formation of a Maine regiment which was added to the meager forces of the Continental symy.

Not so generally known, however, is the tradition that it was due to the fascinations of a beautiful woman that Portland was destroyed and another town preserved.

When the British commander, Cap tain Mowatt, on board his flagship, the Capceau, anchored with his fleet in Portland's inner harbor, he did not revent to her citizens that the unscrupulous little god of love and been his pilot. Instead, on a bright October morning to 1775, he can up the royal ensign on his fleet and at B o'check began a bombardment that fasted up interruptedly until it o'clock at night Portland was unprepared for such a visitation, and there was no attempt at defeuse, the inhabitants simply swarming the streets with their ox carts and horses and attempting to seek safety by flight to the open country back from the water front.

So close did the assalling vessels approach that under cover of the hombardment they landed sallors who per virded the town, setting fire to such buildings as bad escaped damage from hot shot and exploding bombs. Before Captain Mowatt had completed the sacrifice he desired to lay before love's shrine three-quarters of the town was totally destroyed, including the municipal buildings, churches, public ilbrary, fire engine bouses, warehouses, wharfs and shipping.

All that he left was a handful of the poorer hovels, every residence of importance being bombarded or set on fire and 5,000 inhabitants left shelteriess at the approach of winter. To make it practically certain that aid could not come to the seaport by water be destroyed all but one wharf and took with him on his departure all the vessels anchored in the harbor that

had been spared from the torch.
