Last Day's Session Devoted to Prohibition Law—Goldsboro Next Meeting Place.

Raleigh, Dec. 8.—The fourth and final day of the North Carolina Baptists state convention at Winston-Salem today was featured by the earnest manifestations of attempts to better the conditions surrounding the practical enforcement of the State prohibition laws of North Carolina. Strong resolutions were finally adopted calling upon the church members and Christian people of the State of all denominations and irrespective of church connection to unite in an effort to rid every community of these lawbreaking social clubs.

Among the addresses of the day were several on the subject of the laymen's movement, including those of Messrs. E. P. Hobgood, of Greensboro, and J. T. Henderson, of Bristol, Va., the latter being secretary of the laymen's missionary movement of the Southern Baptist church. Various committees were named to attend the various departments of church work and report to the next conference which is to meet at Goldsboro one year hence.

The United States battleship Maine, which sank beneath the waters of Havana harbor in February, 1908, as the result of an explosion, was blown up from the outside. This was announced by the naval board which has been examining the wreck.

Vaccination for Hog Cholera.

Salisbury Post.
