WESTERN CAROLINA RICH

Its Resources are Boundless—Shipments of Various Commodities to Outside World.

Asheville, Jan. 10.—Few people have any idea of the boundless resources of the western part of this State, when it comes to actual figures, although it is common enough to speak of them as "boundless." Some conception of the money they are bringing into the western counties every year can be gained by getting the figures of some of the principal products that are shipped out, and making an estimate of their worth. These figures are large enough, even though they do not represent a hundredth part of the resources. In lumber alone it is estimated that about 156,000,000 feet were shipped out of western North Carolina during the year of 1911, and these figures represent only the dimension lumber and not building material, furniture, etc. At an average of \$25 for 1,000 feet amounts to nearly \$4,000,000.

District Freight Agent Orr of the Southern Railway has finished compiling the number of carloads of commodities that the Southern has taken out of the western part of the State. The figures furnished by Mr. Orr simply represent the number of carloads and the averages on which the estimates were made were obtained elsewhere.

BUSINESS INCREASES.

Mr. Orr stated that, while the shipments were a little off as regards a few lines of commodities the general business had increased during the past year.

The freight territory covered by the figures takes in more than the Asheville division; that is it takes in what is considered the western part of the State, from the east as far as Salisbury to the Tennessee line on the west and to Murphy on the southwest.

Taking up the lumber, there were nearly 13,000 cars shipped in 1911, in actual figures 12,913. Each car will average at least 13,000 feet; lumbermen say that they will sometimes run as high as 20,000 feet. But at 13,000 as an average this would be in round numbers 167,000,000 feet and, at \$25 a 1,000 feet would amount to over \$4,297,000.

This is an average of over 1,000 carloads of lumber a month, and as a matter of fact there were about 1,000 each month during the year. The smallest number shipped was in December, which was 926; and the greatest was in the month of May, which was 1,201 cars.

OTHER WOODS.

Besides this, there were 14,037 carloads of acid wood shipped during the year. Counting 12 cords to the car, which is very low, this would total nearly 170,000 cords; and at \$5 per cord, which is also low, it brought nearly \$850,000. There were also nearly 2,000 carloads of bark, the actual number being 1,978, an average of over 150 a month. The building material shipped out during the year amounted to 1,736 carloads and the box shucks to 1,102 carloads.

One of the most important items is that of furniture. The western part of the State is fairly in its infancy in this industry, but during the year 1911 there were 3,969 carloads shipped. This is much greater than that of the year before and it is steadily growing. It is said that there is a furniture factory at Marion that ships more than any single factory in the State.

Another important item in the freight shipments is that of cattle and other livestock. The Southern Railway, as well as other interests, are striving to encourage this industry, and it is already assuming

large proportion. These figures would be larger but for the fact that the farmers and meat men are feeding a great many cattle in this section, instead of shipping them away to be fattened. As it is, it is shown by rough calculations that the live stock shipments from the western part of the State are valued at almost half a million dollars for last year.

LIVE STOCK SHIPPED

According to the data furnished by Mr. Orr, there were shipped 459 carloads. Counting 30 cattle to the carload, would make the number 13,770; and these at \$33 each would be valued at \$454,410. Of course, some of the cars were made up of hogs and sheep, but a car of sheep or hogs would be equally as valuable as a car of cattle, if not more so.

To show the proportion of the three classes, the figures of the live stock shipped from Clyde were obtained from another source. From this station alone there were 112 carloads of cattle shipped, in actual numbers 3,416 head. These were valued at over \$112,000. There were over 1,500 sheep shipped from Clyde, valued at about \$8,000. There were some 300 hogs estimated at \$1,500. From reliable information it is learned that the poultry and eggs shipped from this place were worth more than the cattle, sheep and hogs.
