James Kelly will manage the Greensboro baseball club during the 1916 season.

Dr. Chas. L. Minor has been elected president of the Buncombe County Medical Society.

Eight Wake county Confederate Veterans who were entitled to pensions died during the year.

Nineteen automobiles and property amounting to \$30,000 was destroyed by fire at Wilmington a few days ago.

Edward R. Bacon of New York made provision in his will for a gift of \$100,000 for a hospital at Biltmore.

Signs warning automobiles, drays and carriages to keep to the right have been placed at the intersection of the principal streets of Hickory.

D. L. Robertson, of Marmaduke, recently killed a full blooded Duroc hog, which weighed 640 pounds when dressed.

Alfred J. Drapalik, a machinist of the Atlantic Coast Line at Rocky Mount, has just been given a patent upon what is considered the most slightly, and most sanitary street can yet devised.

A bunch of Rockingham county farmers will visit Hickory and Statesville during the first week in the new year for the purpose of inspecting the dairy farms and creamery in that county and the Iredell test farm near Statesville.

Mr. Jesse M. Jones, Agricultural and Field Agent of the United States Department of Agriculture, has been secured to deliver the principal address on Swine Day, a feature of the meeting of the North Carolina Livestock Association at Salisbury, January 25.

Maj. George L. Peterson of Sampson county was in Raleigh recently with Adjutant General Young and brought the story of Sampson's "lay-out" to Julian Street and Wallace Morgan, who were here a few weeks ago writing up North Carolina for Collier's.

Material is now being placed for an addition to the warehouse of the People's Bonded Warehouse & Storage Co., at Gastonia. For the first time since it was built about four years ago this warehouse is full and the company is using the Farmers' Union warehouse to stock the overplus.

Demand for hardwood is on the increase, if anything, according to reports made by dealers in the western part of the state, but the congestion of traffic on the Pennsylvania and other Eastern roads is interfering seriously with the filling of export orders.

The prize winning essay on the wisdom and necessity of preparedness, submitted in the contest held under the auspices of the National Security League at New York for the prize of \$500 offered by Jules S. Bache, of New York, was written by Landon M. Townsend, of Raeford, N. C.

"Step to one side, I want to shoot you." Failing to stand aside, Hayes was killed by Frank Foster, who had issued the command. Foster submitted and is held without bond.

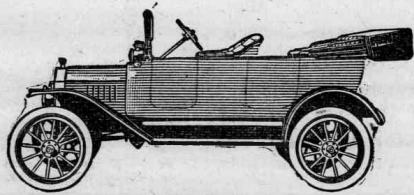

### Great Work Started.

"That an open air school has been organized in Iredell County and is successfully working is good news," says the State Board of Health. "What we need is more of them," says the Board, "and more lady school supervisors to plan them and make them accomplish their purpose."

The above school referred to is at Harmony High School in Iredell and is conducted in a pavilion formerly used for camp-meeting purposes. Miss Celeste Hankel, Assistant Superintendent of this county, writes that great good has already been accomplished and that the plans are broadening for a much greater service. One of the plans provides that the Domestic Science Class of the school will furnish hot milk and cocoa to the children who are below normal physically and otherwise in poor health.

The Board says that those communities and schools that actively sold Red Cross Seals this Christmas could no more wisely spend the money raised from the proceeds of the sale than by converting it into an open air school for tuberculous and subnormal children. This would be fighting tuberculosis at an important and probably the most strategic point.
