Carranza Troops Save Americans from Kidnappers.

Brownsville, Tex., Jan. 27.—Privates William C. Wheeler and Viggo Pederson of Battery D. Fourth Field Artillery, who were kidnapped late yesterday by Mexicans and taken south from the border, were rescued by Carranza soldiers and brought to Matamoros today. They were turned over to American authorities dressed in Mexican clothes.

No word had been heard from the men since their crossing of the river. They wore no clothes. A searching party was sent out from Matamoros by Col. B. R. Quintanilla, commander of the border in the absence of Gen. Alfred Ricaut, and at some early morning hour the Americans were found.

Wheeler and Pederson said they were decoyed to the Mexican side of the river by the promise of a drink of mescal by a Mexican who appeared on the bank while they were swimming.
