



INCREASING THE CORN YIELD

Result of Interesting Experiment Conducted With Alfalfa by North Dakota Station.

At the North Dakota experiment station, where manure and alfalfa sod preceded corn, the yield was 72.9 bushels per acre in 1915 and 56.9 bushels per acre in 1914, while the yield of corn following corn in 1913 was 52 bushels per acre and in 1914 was 38.7 bushels per acre. This made an increase of 20.9 bushels in 1913 and 18.2 bushels in 1914, or an average increase of 19.5 bushels per acre due to alfalfa and manure preceding the corn

DISPOSAL OF DEAD ANIMALS

Burning Large Carcasses Is Difficult and Laborious and Requires Large Amount of Fuel.

Dead animals on the farm should be buried deep enough to prevent them from being dug up again, or they should be burned. To burn large carcasses like those of dead horses and cattle is difficult and laborious and requires a large quantity of fuel. In most instances it is more economical to bury them.

All animals which have died of infectious diseases and are buried should be covered with a heavy layer of lime before the graves are closed.

No Second Primary in Congressional Race.

Senator Zebulon Weaver of Asheville, is the democratic nominee for congress from the Tenth congressional district. A telegram from Judge M. H. Justice, of Rutherfordton, runner-up in the recent statewide primary, received yesterday by Senator Weaver, annot call for a second primary, but, in the interest of harmony and for the best interests of the democratic party, will not ask the democrats to go to the polls again. Judge Justice also offers congratulations to Senator Weaver and pledges his earnest support to the successful nominee in the November elections.

Official returns from the Tenth district were received by The Citizen yesterday, and show the votes of the various candidates as follows: Zebulon Weaver, 4,583; Judge M. H. Justice, 3,074; Sol. Gallert, 2,-043; Frank S. Hewitt, 803. This makes the total vote cast for congressman in the Tenth district 10,-503, with 5,252 necessary to nominate. Mr. Weaver lacked just 669 votes of having the necessary number, but his plurality over Judge Justice, his next nearest opponent, was 1,059 votes.

The action of Judge Justice in withdrawing from a second primary, and not forcing the democrats to go to the polls again met with the warmest commendation here yesterday among the leading democrats of the city, and at the same time, assured Senator Weaver of a solid backing against Congressman James J. Britt in the November elections. Both Mr. Hewitt and Mr. Gallert have already tendered congratulations, and have promised their earnest support to Mr. Weaver this fall, Mr. Gallert, in particular, expressing his intention of "taking off his coat" in the interests of the democratic party, as he has so often done before.

"This action of Judge Justice," declared a leading democrat yesterday, "will do a great deal toward cementing the interests of the democratic party in the district in ane supreme effort this fall, and I am satisfied that, when the returns from the November election are in and counted, it will be found that the democrats of the district are again represented in congress."

No Second Primary for State Officers.

Sawdust will extinguish small fires in garages, and its value is greatly increased by the addition of bicarbonate

of soda (baking powder).

The sawdust floats and forms a blanket over the burning oil, while bicarbonate of soda, when exposed to heat, gives off carbon dioxide gas, which helps to prevent combustion by shutting off access of air. A mixture of 10 pounds of bicarbonate to 1 bushel of sawdust has been found to be

AMERICAN UNION CLAIMS PAID.

Insurance Commissioner Young of North Carolina on Wednesday mailed checks to all North Carolina claimants in the American Union and Monongahela cases. The bonding com pany, in accordance with the judgment of the court, has paid in in the American Union case \$11,050 and in the Monogahela case \$5,517:69. The agents had settled all these claims and they are now recouped by this return of premiums. In the first case claimants get about one per cent less than the principal and interest of their claims, while in the latter claimants get about one per cent less than the principal of their claims. The allowance for the North Carolina agents is after the deduction of the suits, and the agents were allowed their commissions.-Weekly Underwriter.
