Cheese Making Progressing Rapidly in the Mountains.

Extension Farm-News.

Mr. F. R. Farnham, cheese specialist of the Extension Service, is back from a trip to Ohio, where he purchased a carload of pure-bred Holstein cattle for the cheese factory patrons of Watauga county. Twenty-seven cows and one bull are included in the shipment. These cattle will be shipped to Zionville, in Watauga county.

There are at present five cheese factories operating in this county, making a total of eleven that have been constructed in the mountain district. It has been found that the native cattle of the section do not give milk enough only for four months' operation in the summer. The native cattle were originally bought for beef instead of milk. With the addition of the pure-bred Holsteins to the territory, it is expected to run the factories through the winter. Cheese made in this section has been selling at the high price of 20 cents per pound, wholesale, and the patrons of the factories are preparing for running the industry the year around instead of in the summer months, as heretofore. Holstein cattle give milk for about ten months and will be a decided improvement over the old scrubs.

Italians Move Another Step Forward—More Prisoners Taken.

London, Oct. 12.—Another step forward in their quest of Trieste has been made by the Italians in the region south of Gorizia, additional points of vantage to their progress having been captured and 1,771 men made prisoners.

In this region, which is about sixteen miles northwest of Trieste, and in the Julian Alps, to the east, the Italians from August 6 to the present report they have captured 30,881 Austrians.

Negligence for a Minor to Drive an Auto.

Raleigh, Oct. 11.—That it is negligence for a minor to drive an automobile with the consent of the owner, in violation of the State statute prohibiting persons under 16 years old to operate a machine, is the ruling of the Supreme Court in the case of Taylor, administrator, vs J. W. Stewart, from New Bern.

On the strength of this ruling the plaintiff gets a new trial in a suit for damages in which Lee J. Taylor is the plaintiff, seeking to recover damages for the death of his little child under the wheels of an automobile driven by James Stewart, son of the defendant, while a negro chauffeur sat beside him.

The lad driving the machine was 13 years old. He had been allowed to drive the machine by his father and it was pleaded by the prosecution that for this reason the chauffeur felt justified in letting the boy run the car when the owner had really sent the car out with the chauffeur in charge.

Burglars Visit Morganton Store.

Morganton, Oct. 12.—A daring robbery occurred here last night. Burglars forced an entrance into the Morganton Hardware company's store by the rear door and left as evidence of their entrance a bored hole about six inches square in the door, by means of which hole they located the lock and drove it off. Examination of the stock has shown missing four pistols and a number of pocket-knives. The safe was untouched. Evidently the burglars were amateurs. No clues have yet been found as to the guilty party or parties.
