State Board Issues Circular Letter Covering Registration of Women. The State Board of Elections has

issued the following circular letter to the chairmen of the county Boards of Election throughout the State relative to registration of votters, male and female, for the coming general election in November:

"As the time approaches for opening of the registration books and otherwise preparing for the General Election of November 2nd, 1920, this letter is issued to the County Boards of Election for their information and guidance.

"First. The State Board of Elections urges that every member of the County Boards of Elections become thoroughly familiar with the Election Law and in the event that any part of it is not fully understood this office should be communicated with at once.

Second. We call attention to several important matters as follows:

"The Registration Books to cover the General Election of November 2, 1920, will open on September 30, 1920, and will close at sunset on October 23rd, 1920.
