**REVENUE RAIDERS FIRED ON AND OFFICER SHOTS NEGRO**

John Lail, of Marion, Seriously Wounded John Logan, Colored, in Raid on Cedar Creek, Rutherford County.

While making a raid on an illicit distilling plant on Cedar Creek, in Rutherford county, yesterday, officers were fired on from ambush, but none of the three officials was hit. After cutting up the still Prohibition Agent John Lail, of Marion, who is connected with the Asheville office, went to a house about 250 yards from the still, having seen negroes going in the house after several shots had been fired from ambush. Upon the approach of officers the negroes were asked why they had shot at the officers. After questioning them it is reported that a negro named John Logan endeavored to attack Officer Lail with a gun. Lail is said to have knocked the gun from the negro's hand and pushed him on the porch. The negro again endeavored to attack the officer, according to reports reaching here last night, whereupon Lail shot him, the ball taking effect in the negro's back.

The officers, after making arrangements to have the negro carried to a hospital, proceeded to Rutherfordton, where Lail advised the sheriff of the incident. Deputy Sheriff George Hemphill, of Rutherford county, was with Mr. Lail when the affair took place, and John Connor, rural policeman, was also among those who were fired on from ambush. Mr. Lail was advised by the sheriff that he would be sent for if needed. Mr. Lail then returned to his home at Marion.

The negro was said to have been shot in a dangerous place and his condition was considered serious, it being thought that the wound might prove fatal.

A 70-gallon old fashioned copper still was seized and destroyed, while the copper was hot, and about 1,000 gallons of beer poured out.

According to the information reaching here, the officers were approaching the blockade plant when they were fired upon for the first time. However, they proceeded in the direction of the moonshine still and upon their arrival began the destruction of the liquor manufacturing plant. While destroying the still and pouring out the 1,000 gallons of beer, the officers were again fired on, Winchester bullets clipping off twigs around their heads.

It was when this shooting began that the officers are reported to have seen persons running towards the house where the negro was later shot.

Prohibition Agent Lail seems to be a marked man by the blockaders, it having been only a few weeks ago when he was in a party of officers who were fired upon from ambush while raiding a still in Henderson county. It was in that raid that Agent Hampton was missed by only a small margin by a bullet from a blockader's rifle which pierced his coat sleeve.

**SOUTHERN'S LOYALTY MEDAL FOR 514 OF "OLD GUARD."**

Washington, Oct. 2.—Five hundred and fourteen of the Southern Railway System's "Old Guard"—employees who have been in its service for twenty-five years or more—will in the near future be given the "loyalty medal" which is presented to each employe who completes a quarter of century of service with the Southern, presentation to be made at different points in the South. The "Old Guard" now numbers 4,405.

The employes to whom medals are to be given are those who have been graduated into the twenty-five year class since March 1918, when the last presentation of medals was made with the exception of those presented in Washington a few days ago to eleven employes, including President Fairfax Harrison.
