Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Marion, N. C. Section 1. That is shall be unlawful for any person to engage in roller-skating, or the riding of Kiddje-Kars, Skeeter Wagons, Express Wagons, velocipedes, tricycyles, or other means of transportation used by children in their play, between the curbs of any of the paved streets in the Town of Marion, or on either sidewalk on Main Street between the Wrenn Building at the corner of State Street, and the First Baptist church at the corner of Church Street.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this section. or the parents of any child, under the age of sixteen years, allowing their said child to violate any of the provisions of this Act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and punishable by a fine in the sum of five (\$5.00) dollars for each and every offense. Violation on each day shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be in force from and after its adoption. Adopted by unanimous vote of the Board of Aldermen, August 21, 1922.
