### GREENLEE IS ELECTED TO FEDERATION OFFICE

J. H. Greenlee, McDowell county farmer, was elected to the board of directors of the Farmers Federation at the annual meeting of stockholders in Asheville last Saturday. Already serving as a member of the board is Winslow Burgin, a farmer of this county.

About 300 farmers and farm women from Caldwell to Cherokee county attended the Asheville meeting. The principal business transacted was the election of 16 regular directors and four directors-at-large. The new board of directors met in the afternoon at the Federation's central office and reelected James G. K. McClure of Fairview, president; R. C. Crowell of Candler, vice-president; and O. J. Holler of Union Mills, secretary and treasurer. The directors also reelected an executive committee consisting of Mr. McClure, Mr. Crowell, Mr. Holler, L. L. Burmin of Horse Shoe; H. A. Coggins of Swannanoa; H. Arthur Osborne of Canton, and C. C. Cook, of Asheville, R.F.D. No. 4.

Net earnings of slightly more than \$17,000 for 1939 were reported by Guy M. Scales, general manager of the Federation. This earning enabled the Federation to pay the regular three percent semi-annual dividend on both common and preferred stock, and a three percent dividend payable in credit toward the purchase of additional shares, it was explained. The sales volume for the year was placed at \$1,077,000 as compared with \$966,671 for the previous year, and total assets were listed at \$520,000 and net worth at \$218,906.21.

### MRS. KANIPE DIES AT HOME AT WEST MARION

Mrs. Mary Emma Kanipe, 69, died suddenly of a heart attack at her residence in West Marion on Sunday evening.

Funeral services were conducted at the West Marion Methodist church Tuesday afternoon at 2 o'clock by Rev. F. R. Barber, assisted by Rev. J. W. Kelley. Burial was in Hoover cemetery.

Surviving are her husband, H. Alexander Kanipe, four daughters and three sons, Mrs. Allie Lavender and Mrs. Ernest Knowles of East Marion, Mrs. Howard McKinney, Lawrence Sherlin and Jeter Kanipe of West Marion, Clarence Kanipe of Swannanoa, and Fred Kanipe of Rock Hill. She is also survived by four sisters and four brothers, Mrs. Charles Crawley and Mrs. Cora Epley of Marion, Mrs. Robert Lentz of Morganton, Mrs. Hennie Babb of Waldo, Fla., Meredith Potat of Morganton, and Elbert and Bruce Potat of Marion.
