

Bechtler, only man ever to mint gold privately for the United States Government, died penniless. During the period when North Carolina was producing more gold than any other state in the Union, Aug. Bechtler and his father, goldsmiths of Ruth-erfordton, North Carolina, were commissioned to mint one, two and one-half, and five dollar gold-pieces for the government.

The coins are odd in their design, bearing the name of their manufacturer, Aug. Bechtler. Also on the coins is the legend "North Carolina gold" or in some cases merely "Car-olina gold." The ore for the coins was mined within a few miles of the private mint and its quality was indicated on the coin.
