Old Fort, May 27.—Miss Caroline Sandlin, younger daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Sandlin, of Old Fort, has recently been elected to membership in the Rollins Key Society which will form the nucleus for the Phi Beta Kappa membership when Rollins gets its charter at commencement time. Previously Miss Sandlin has been tapped for Libra, highest honor conferred upon co-eds for scholastic ranking on the Rollins campus.

Miss Sandlin is a member of Phi Kappa Delta, national honorary organization for those excelling in oratory. She won first place in the provincial tournament held by that society at its convention in Farmville, Va., last year, and won first place also in the Sprague Oratorical contest held in Florida last year. Miss Sandlin represented Rollins at the national oratorical contest held in Knoxville in March, and after winning, in nine rounds was defeated in semi-finals by the contestant from the University of Nebraska.

Miss Sandlin has achieved membership in Theta Alpha Phi, national honorary fraternity in dramatics. She won acclaim in a dozen of leading Florida cities last year when she toured Florida with Rollins Players and took the role opposite Fred Stone in his famous play, "Lightnin'." This year she has played leading roles in "The Fool," "Sun-Up," and "Ghosts," in the Annie Russell Theatre, Winter Park.

Miss Sandlin has served as vice-president of the national honorary society of Phi Beta, and during her senior year has been president of the Rollins chapter of the national social sorority, Kappa Kappa Gamma. Miss Sandlin was chosen for membership in National Collegiate Who's Who.
