Dr. Fishbein said: "People who worry too much about the war spend sleepless nights, get headaches and lose their appetites. They must switch their mental think-

ing from worry to confidence.
"They must believe in their government, believe that it is doing the right thing and believe that it can not fail.

"Above all, they must keep busy. Work for the Red Cross is a good outlet. There is a lot to be done and a person should have no difficulty in finding a spot where his or her services can be used.

"The busy man or woman has no time for jitters. Work and confidence combined make a splendid antidote."
