Most public and private offices in Marion will close today at noon, Tuesday, and will remain closed all day Wednesday.

The post office will be closed all day Wednesday and there will be no deliveries, city or rural, with the exception of special delivery mail, per-

ishable mail and gift packages.

Grocery stores in Marion will be closed Wednesday and Thursday, with the exception of two stores which will be closed one day only, General stores will be Wednesday.
