

PEACE AT ANY PRICE

"Everybody may have peace if they are willing to pay any price for it," declares Admiral William D. Leahmy, Chief of Staff of the Presi-

The Admiral points out that "part of this price is slavery, dishonor of young women, destruction of your homes and denial of your God" and adds that he has seen "all of these abominations in other parts of the world paid as the price of not resist-

ing invasion." The naval officer wants the nations of the world, at the end of this war, to enter a solemn agreement to join forces at once in war against any nation that violates the sovereignty or the territory of any other nation. He thinks this would make impossible any successful aggress-

BEACH DEFENSES POWERFUL

The successful establishment of an adequate beachhead on the Cherbourg peninsula has led many Americans to conclude that the German defenses were not as strong as expected.

This conclusion seems to be erconeous and, in a measure, detracts from the magnificent accomplishment of our ships, planes, and men.


