## **Election On Wine And Beer** To Be Held August 31st

#### INJUNCTION IS DENIED BY JUDGE DAN MOORE

An injunction seeking to restrain Steppe Addresses the board of elections of McDowell county from holding an election on Marion Kiwanians the question of the sale of beer and wine in McDowell county on August 31 was denied by Judge Dan K. Moore at Columbus, Polk county, last Monday.

In a beer and wine election the law requires that petitions be signed by 15 per cent of the registered voters who voted for governor in the last general election.

The petition calling for the election was signed by over 1750 persons, it was stated, and that after checking the signatures the board of elections ruled that 1200 were qualified voters.

The voters of McDowell county will go to the polls next Tuesday, August 31, to ballot on the issue of legal sale of beer and wine in this county.

The ballots, it is understood, will offer the voters the opportunity to express himself on two propositions. He may vote "for the legal sale of wine" or "against the legal sale of wine"; and "for the legal sale of beer" or "against the legal sale of beer."

Beer is now sold legally in this county.
