Education backers sent in an amendment (in the joint appropriations committee) that would add \$10 million a year to the school budget. It would be used mainly for increased teacher pay.

It was the largest mass meeting at a legislative hearing in the memory of veteran legislators.

The hearing was held to discuss the school machinery act. But that wasn't even mentioned. Instead, spokesmen for the crowd told the joint appropriations and education committees that they wanted more money for teachers, more money for school building.

They said they didn't care what the cost was, it would be worth it. They added that they were perfectly willing to pay higher taxes. If necessary, to improve the school system.

They said they wanted the best for North Carolina children, on an equal basis — and now.

The joint finance committee came out with its revenue bill. It would add about \$200,000 a year to anticipated revenue, House Committee Chairman Larry More of Wilson said.

Several bits of sniping were taken at Governor Scott. The finance committee postponed indefinitely action on a proposed tax of soft drinks. The same group said it would not consider the proposed \$208 million rural road bond issue until after the revenue bill had been passed. The Senate killed 28-14 a bill

that would have given the Governor authority to appoint public representatives on 10 of the state's 21 licensing boards.

SCOTT'S GAINS On the favorable side of the ledger, a Senate judiciary committee amended and favorably reported a Scott-suggested measure setting up personnel department.

Probably the most important postive action taken was the quick passage by both Houses of a bill giving teachers and state employes a 20 per cent raise retroactive to October 1, 1948. The raise is effective for the rest of the current fiscal year.

Both Houses also passed a bill approving the Governor's signing a pact with other southern states to establish regional schools. Also keyed by the Senate and House was a measure giving the state treasurer broader powers to invest state funds.

The House passed a bill to allow life imprisonment in all capital cases, upon recommendation of the jury. It killed a measure that would have done away with drivers' license exams and set up a "mail-order" license system.

The Senate passed a bill cutting the tax on oleomargarine wholesalers and permitting serving of colored oleo in public eating places.

An attempt to put some sort of motor vehicle inspection back in the law books wound up with the Senate roads committee okeying a bill calling for the State Highway patrol to spot-check cars. The same group killed an attempt to have an annual inspection with one lane in every county and a limited list of items to be checked.
