Among this week's new books are a number of titles for Home Demonstration Club Members. Each one of the following titles are listed on the 1949 Home Demonstration Club List.

"I Love My Doctor" by Evelyn Barkins—A good-natured story of the first year of the marriage of a law student bride and her fledgling doctor husband.

"Tobias Brandywine" by Dan Wickenden—A shabby old man befriended by a family becomes their mainstay. This is a tale of a gentle sentiment and kindness.

"It's Greek to Me" by Willie Snow Etheridge—The author describes her trip to Greece and other countries in Southeastern Europe as the wife of a member of one of the United Nations Commission. Her book is by turns laughable and impulsive, sobered and sympathetic.

"Cry, the Beloved Country" by Alan Paton—A novel of South Africa which tells of the search of Kumalo, an Anglican pastor, for his son. He finds tragedy, but a young man's ideals of social justice and the old priest's character combine to begin the remaking of the land.

"Profile of Europe" by Sam Welles—written by a man who has worked for our State Department in Europe, this book tells of Europe's people and leaders and its areas of tension and gives the basic information needed to understand what is happening there.

"The Story of Induraja" by Hilde Weraher—Story of a Hindu widow who did much in breaking down Indian customs which forbid a widow to talk to men, or to be seen in public, or to remarry.

"Hearthstones" by Bernice Kelly Harris—Novel of the Roanoke

"I Thee Wed" by Gilbert Gabriel—Historical novel based on the building of one of the refuges planned in America for Marie Antoinette. The scene is laid in Pennsylvania, and the hero is Alan Ruff, a young surveyor, Gay Leguay, a little French sewing girl, surprisingly like the queen, also plays an important part in the romance.

"Mahatma Gandhi, and Interpretation" by E. S. Jones—This interpretation of Gandhi's personality, his ideas and influence written by a well-known missionary portrays not only Gandhi but reiterates the author's faith in Christianity.

"The Nazarov" by Markoosha Fischer—Story of the Nazarov family from the end of Czarism to the approach of the second World War personalizes the history of Russia in that period.

"I Learn from Children" by Caroline Pratt—Convinced that children want to learn and that they could learn best through first hand experience, the author launched her own City and Country School on 1901. Considered reckless at the time, Miss Pratt is today honored for her vision and accomplishments.

"Roanoke Hundred" by Inglis Fletcher—Story of the unsuccessful attempt of Sir Richard Grenville to establish a colony on Roanoke Island in 1585. (New copies of this book have been added to our

"Bride of Fortune" by Harnett Kane—Story of Varina Howell Davis and of her life with her husband, Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederacy.

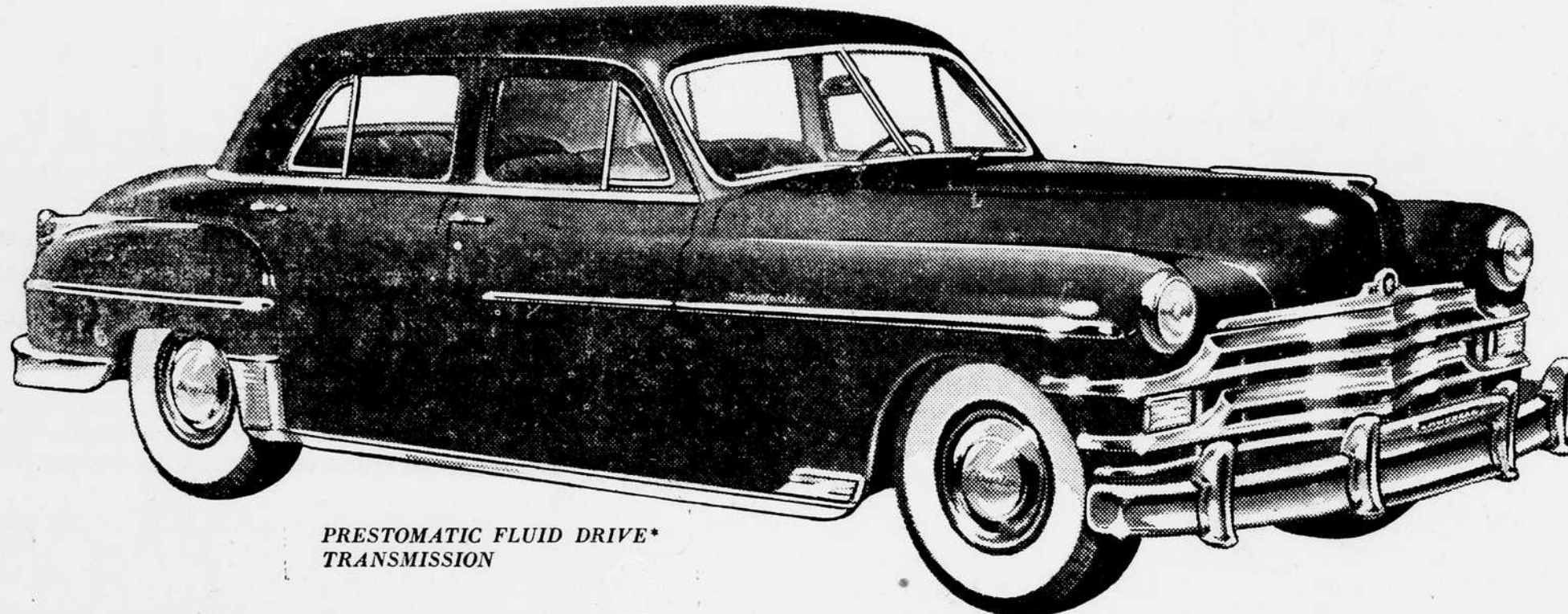
