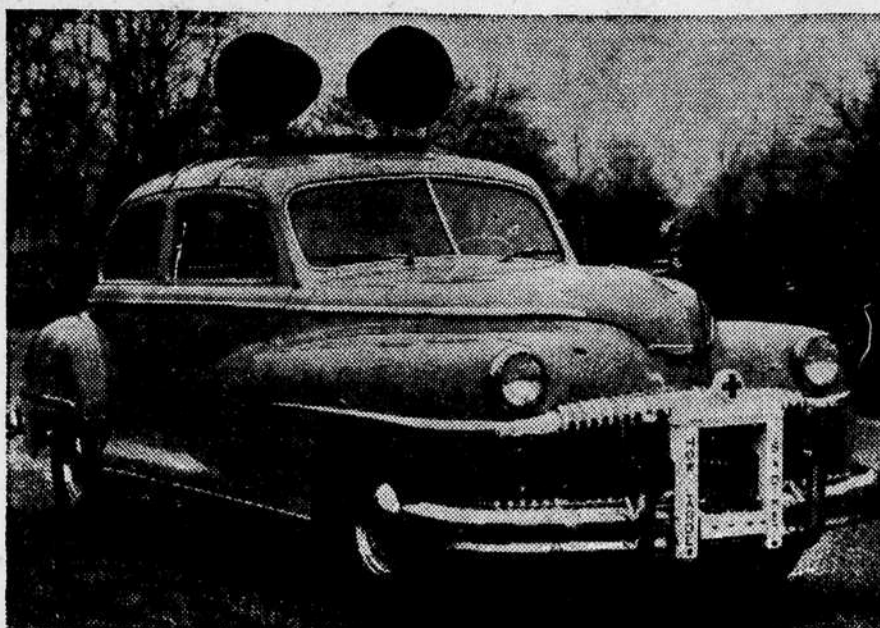


WOMANLESS WEDDING
