**DATE CHANGED**  
**FOR MEETING**  
**OF CORN GROWERS**

A Corn Production meeting scheduled for April 5 has been changed to April 7, S. L. Homewood, county agent, said Monday.

The meeting will begin at 7:30 p. m. at the court house. Dr. E. H. Collins, agronomy extension specialist, will speak, pointing out the principal errors being made by farmers in producing corn. This will be followed by the presentation of a film entitled, "More Corn Per Acre."

The movie is a 16-millimeter film made in color and runs for 25 minutes. It tells the story of how several hundred Tar Heel farmers have increased their corn yields to more than 100 bushels per acre during the past few years.

All of the principal actors are North Carolina farmers shown at work on their own farms. Counties in which scenes were taken include Currituck, Nash, Alamance, Forsyth, Henderson, Bertie, Union, Richmond and others.

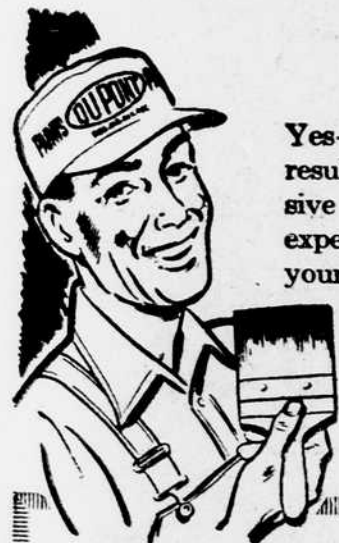
