Since strawberry season is here, here are a few timely suggestions for preserving strawberries by freezing:

Select ripe, firm, red berries. Pick over and discard over-ripe or soft berries. Place one pound, or a small amount at a time in a collander. Wash by lifting the collander up and down in cold, or ice water, until berries are clean. Cap after washing.

Place capped berries in a bowl. Add 1 part sugar to four parts berries. Slice with a slicer. Place in moisture - vapor - proof containers. Press out all air and seal air tight. (Berries may be sliced by hand.) 
