At this meeting it was pointed out that due to increased State appropriations for public health that McDowell county could have the same or better public health services at no increased cost to the taxpayers. Under the present arrangement one physician serves all three counties, and under the new plan all of the employees and health officers, including a doctor, one and possibly two nurses, a sanitary officer and a clerk, would devote full time to McDowell county.

NOTICE OF ORDER AUTHORIZING \$80,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following order relating to the issuance of \$80,000 for the purpose of erecting additions to schoolhouses in McDowell County was adopted by the Board of County Commissioners of McDowell County in regular session on May 2, 1949.

Ordered that bonds of the county shall be issued to the maximum aggregate principal amount of \$80,000 for the purpose of erecting additions to schoolhouses necessary for maintaining the six months' term required by the Constitution. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected. A statement of the county debt for school purposes has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection. This order shall take effect thirty days after the first publication thereof after final passage, unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under The County Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters of the county at an election as provided in the said Act.

The following resolution was unanimously passed: RESOLVED, that the county accountant is hereby designated as the officer to file with the clerk the statement of debt required to be filed in connection with the bond order this day introduced relating to not exceeding \$80,000 bonds for erecting additions to schoolhouses. The time and day for a public hearing upon the said bond order is hereby fixed as 10 o'clock A. M. on the 17th day of May, 1949.

The foregoing order was finally passed on the 17th day of May, 1949, and was first published on the 19th day of May, 1949. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said order must be commenced within thirty (30) days after its first publication.
